Admission Arrangements for Year 6 to Year 7 Transfer for Tauheedul Islam Boys' High School

Tauheedul Islam Boys' High School (TIBHS) is part of the Tauheedul Education Trust. As an 11-18 progressive, inclusive and outstanding Muslim faith school, the Governing Body welcomes applications from families of other faiths and non-faiths.

General information

Before applying for admission, parent(s) / carer(s) are advised to find out more information about the school and the admission arrangements that will be followed. You can do this by:

- attending the Open Evening at TIBHS
- visiting our website at www.tibhs.com
- reading the Blackburn with Darwen Council's (BwDBC's) 'Admission to secondary school – information for parent(s) / carer(s) composite prospectus.'

Application procedure

1. You must complete your home Local Authority's common application form by 31st October. If you are resident in the area administered by BwDBC, then you can either apply on-line at www.blackburn.gov.uk or complete the paper form, which is available from BwDBC.
2. Unless there are exceptional reasons for the late completion and submission of the common application form, late applications will not be considered at the same time as applications received by the closing date.
3. You are allowed to name 3 different schools on the application form in preference order. You are advised not to name the same school more than once or to only name 1 school, as by doing so, you may limit the chances of gaining admission into one of your preferred schools.
4. If you want your child to gain admission into TIBHS, then it is important that you put TIBHS as your 1st preference school on the application form.

Allocation process

1. The admission process is co-ordinated by BwDBC in accordance with their secondary co-ordinated admission scheme.
2. After the closing date for receipt of applications, BwDBC will provide details of all applications received to TIBHS. BwDBC will not provide TIBHS with details of the rank order of preference of the applications. This is because, by law, all admission authorities must consider all preferences equally.
3. If the school receives fewer applications than the published admission number, then the Governing Body (GB) will advise BwDBC that all applicants can be offered admission into TIBHS.

4. If the school receives more applications than the published admission number, then the GB are legally required to consider all the applications against the school's published admission policy, which can be found at www.tibhs.com
5. After applying the admission policy for the school, the GB will produce a list of children who have the highest priority for admission. This list of children who can be offered admission will be sent to BwDBC. Along with the list of children provided by TIBHS, BwDBC will have similar information for all the schools in the borough and from other Councils.
6. In the initial allocation process, it is possible that children can be offered admission at more than one school. As the law requires that no children must be offered admission at more than one preferred school, BwDBC acting on behalf of all schools will ensure, that the single offer of a school place is made at the highest ranked preferred school on the application form. For example, if a school place can be offered at the 1st and 2nd preference school, a place will be offered at the 1st preference school.
7. In the event that your child can be offered admission at more than one preferred school and In order to avoid missing out on gaining admission into TIBHS, you are advised to consider putting TIBHS as your 1st preference school on the application form.

Offer of a place

1. When the allocation process is finally complete, BwDBC will ensure that on – line applicants will be sent an email on or as soon as possible after 1st March informing you of the school at which a place will be offered. Offer letters will be posted out if you applied using a paper application.
2. If a place is offered at TIBHS, it is important that you advise BwDBC, if you no longer require the place offered. This will allow BwDBC, on behalf of TIBHS, to offer the place to a child who could not initially be offered admission.
3. As TIBHS can only offer admission up to the published admission number, unfortunately, not all children will be offered admission. The letter from BwDBC will provide the reasons why a place could not be offered and the details of the alternative school offered.
4. Details of all children who could not be offered admission at TIBHS will automatically be included on the school's waiting list, where TIBHS is a higher preference than the school at which a place is offered. The waiting list will be maintained by BwDBC, on behalf of the school, in accordance with the school's oversubscription criteria, until 31st December in the academic year of Year 7 admission. Parent(s) / carer(s) are advised to contact the school, if they want their child's details to be kept on the waiting list, from the spring term onwards.
5. The BwDBC decision letter will advise you of your right of appeal to an independent appeal panel against the decision of the GB of TIBHS not to offer your child admission. Further advice/guidance about the appeals process can be found at www.tibhs.com and www.blackburn.gov.uk
