The Faithful Stars 'Core Offer' will nurture the core tenets of Islam – an emphasis on self-discipline, compassion, mutual respect for all and for the earth itself. Please look out for these 'Faithful Stars' initiatives throughout the year and encourage your child to participate in them.

Rabi al Awwal

During the coming days and weeks, we will mark the month of Rabi al Awwal and the birth date of our noble Prophet (Peace Be Upon Him). It is a reminder for all of us of the example and teachings of the Almighty's most beloved and the best amongst all of His creation. In a trouble world and during difficult times, the life and legacy of the noble Prophet (Peace Be Upon Him) is a guiding light for each and every one of us. Manners

Over the next few weeks, we will launch a **manners' drive** encouraging pupils to demonstrate the **best of character** in simple, tangible ways. We will also explain how to do this and why good manners are an important part of school and wider life. Our **six key manners** are:

- 1. Giving Salaam and greeting others.
- 2. To give way to, and hold the door for, others.
- 3. To clean up after myself and have a smart appearance.
- 4. To ask before using other people's things.
- 5. To **speak politely** without raising my voice or interrupting.
- 6. To say 'thank you', 'please' and 'excuse me'.



Please encourage your child to showcase these manners in the home too.

Behaviour

In order to have a **safe** and **happy** school and help students to develop their character and achieve the best possible grades, excellent behaviour and attitude is crucial. The school expects all students to **behave well** at all times, treat others with **respect**, and ensure that they **do not disrupt the learning** of other students.

The new policy identifies:

- Rewards for positive behaviours so that pupils know that excellent learning and character is valued.
- Support and guidance for pupils who struggle to behave well consistently.
- Consistent consequences for 'disruptive' and 'red line' (serious) behaviours.
